Welcome to the January/February edition of 'Something to crow about' newsletter.

FROM THE CLUB PRESIDENT

At the time of preparing this newsletter the Premier announced effective from 6pm Sunday 31st January 2021 until 6pm Friday, 5th February 2021, the Perth Metropolitan area and the Peel and South West regions will enter a 5 day lockdown, based on health advice.

The Premier went onto say these measures are being implemented due to a fast evolving situation in Western Australia with a positive COVID-19 case detected in a hotel quarantine worker.

We also need to be aware from Tuesday 2nd February 2021 mandatory contact registers will be expanded in WA.

The expansion follows a review of WA's contact register system, which has been in place since December 5, 2020 as a precautionary measure.

Additional businesses include:

- retail venues including:
 - supermarkets
 - department stores
 - shopping centres
 - pharmacies
 - hardware
 - retail components of other businesses where customers are physically present such as bank branches.

The Australia Day special Monday night Bingo was a huge success, we had a great crowd, terrific raffles and prizes.

Unfortunately we had to defer Monday 1st Feb Bingo due to the closure, we will advise when Bingo resumes.

Our Friday evening **Lucky Member** draw continues to increase at present it is \$1050. You need to be a member to be in the draw, which takes place between 5.00 – 7.00pm on Fridays.

The other club promotion is the Saturday **Chase the Ace**, the jackpot it is now \$1255 you have to be at the club to have a chance of picking up the jackpot.

The City is making progress with our outside green, we have been provided an update (see below):-

The City has released the Request for Quotation (RFQ) documentation, there was a site visit arranged for 3rd February 2021 (this has been rescheduled due to the COVID closure).

The RFQ's will be returned to the City in mid-February, and the contract awarded in early/mid-March 2021.

The lack of the outside green has impacted our 2020/21 pennant season our Saturday Pennants requiring all 10 rinks which is less than ideal, I would like to thank all bowlers for their patience and understanding during this period.





Our Facility Manager, has provided the following update on works currently under way or planned to be carried out soon.

OUR STAFF




Our staff are at the club every day, they richly deserve our thanks and recognition for a job well done.

Perth, Peel and South West region enters lockdown from 6pm, 31 January 2021

Effective from 6pm Sunday, 31 January until 6pm Friday, 5 February 2021, the Perth metropolitan area, Peel and South West regions will enter a lockdown.

The following restrictions apply for the lockdown period.

- People should not leave Perth, Peel or the South West during this period
- People can enter Perth, Peel or the South West only to access or deliver essential health and emergency services and other essential requirements
- Non-residents currently in Perth, Peel and the South West are required to remain until the end of the restriction period however if you must leave for serious reasons you are to then return home immediately, stay home and get tested if symptoms develop
- Restaurants, cafes, pubs and bars to provide takeaway service only
- Elective surgery and procedures for categories 2 and 3 will be suspended from Tuesday, 2 February. Category 1 and urgent category 2 surgery will continue
- No visitors will be allowed in homes unless caring for a vulnerable person or in an emergency
- No visitors to hospitals or residential aged care and/or disability facilities
- No weddings permitted
- Funerals are limited to 10 people
- Travel remains prohibited within remote Aboriginal communities.



Masks are to be worn at all times when outside of your place of residence, this includes at workplaces and on public transport. For more information about masks, see the [Healthy WA website](#) (this is an external website).

Schools will be closed for this week. Term 1, 2021 was due to start from February 1 but that will be postponed by one week.

The following facilities in the Perth, Peel and South West regions will need to close:

- Schools, universities, TAFEs and education facilities
- Pubs, bars and clubs
- Gyms and indoor sporting venues
- Playgrounds, skate parks and outdoor recreational facilities
- Cinemas, entertainment venues, and casinos
- Beauty therapy services, parlour or salon including hairdressers, barbershop, nail salon, tattoo parlour, spa or massage parlour
- Large religious gatherings and places of worship
- Libraries and cultural institutions
